



Kia ora parents and whanau

Last Friday at Toroa assembly, our Year 6 students presented their leadership speeches to their parents. I was very proud of how they managed to control their nerves and read their speeches and it was lovely to see the proud parents and grandparents hearing how much they are admired by their children and grandchildren.

Teachers are well underway with teaching the first lessons from Keeping Ourselves Safe, a comprehensive child abuse prevention programme for schools. This programme is recommended to be taught in schools every two years and requires a parent consultation meeting. On Monday our police education officer Charlotte Codlin, presented at our meeting for parents and it was great to see a number of parents at our gathering. Charlotte covered the objectives and lesson content for each of the programmes that are based on age and emphasised the importance of the programme in educating children. Teachers complete the first two lessons and Charlotte visits each classroom to teach two lessons. Charlotte will be visiting on Tuesday the 20th of May to do her teaching in each class. You will have been hearing a lot through the media about the new refreshed curriculum for Literacy and Maths. The new curriculum sets higher expectations for what students should know and be able to do at each year level. As a result, your child's progress might look different compared to previous years. This doesn't mean they are falling behind — they are still learning and making progress. What has changed is the standard, which is now more challenging. The shift reflects a stronger, more ambitious curriculum, not a drop in your child's performance.

Teachers are still supporting each child's learning and helping them grow from where they are. This shift is about making sure all students are being challenged and prepared for the future. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's progress, we encourage you to talk with their teacher. The teaching team have designed a draft timeline to work to so that refreshed goals, progress and written comments will be available at the end of Week 8, this term.

On Tuesday, the teaching staff went to walk the cross country course up at Barry and Justine Schroder's farm. The children will be walking the course with the staff and then running it on Wednesday 21st of May with a postponement date of Friday 23rd of May. We will be making a call about postponement on Tuesday afternoon so please watch for messages on the Suburban Whanau and Family Facebook page, Skool Loop and HERO. Please ensure the children are wearing their sports tops and running shoes and perhaps send a change of clothes and shoes. The course is the best school cross country course I have experienced, our students are very lucky! An enormous thanks to Barry and Justine for hosting us.

Parking for the cross country will be soggy. Drive up to the cattle yards and turn in the loop there before coming out and parking facing downhill on the side of the road please. Staff will be putting out cones for hidden culverts so you know where the hazards are when parking on the roadside. Please wear suitable footwear for wet and muddy terrain!

Welcome to our new FORCE students Charlotte, Ned and Mason who have all started in Piwakawaka class this term. We are looking forward to seeing how much you can learn this year!




Game on
