Principal's Message

Kia ora parents and whanau

One of the things I love about our little school is the way the children play within our playground. They take advantage of the wide variety of sports equipment and are often creating imaginative games, usually with children of different age groups. Recently we have been donated some cable reels, thanks to Pip Scott. Some of our students are getting very good at walking on top of the rolling reels!

It was my pleasure to recently host a belated 100% attendance morning tea for the 8 students who had 100% attendance in Term 1. Getting your children to school EVERY day is quite difficult, given the many things we have going on in our families. Students who are at school every day are exposed to the maximum amount of learning time and this is vital in a year when we are introducing a new curriculum. Data is showing that we have a good number of students on track for 100% attendance this term, again, this is quite impressive considering how much illness has been about.

We were delighted to see so many of our students and their whanau at our Matariki Celebration last week, where we acknowledged the rising of the Matariki star cluster which signals the start of the Māori new year. Our students have been taking part in weekly Kapa Haka sessions with Whaea Koha and Whaea Peki, supported by Miss Bonney, who takes the lead when our tutors are unavailable. The progress and growth in confidence has been amazing over the six months and the children enjoyed the opportunity to show their families the songs they have been learning. Thank you to everyone who came along and enjoyed Matariki mā Puanga: Celebrating Together.

As part of our Board processes, I have been reviewing our emergency planning document. This document contains the processes we will follow in the event of an emergency. The process has posed some interesting questions and scenarios for me to consider and thanks to everyone who I have approached looking for information. Last week Annie and I were working on how we would contact parents in an emergency. You should all have received a text via HERO informing you about the non uniform day this Thursday. We were actually testing the system to ensure it works for all parents, so if you did not receive this text, it means your mobile number in HERO is not correct! It is critical that we have the correct contact details for parents and emergency contacts in HERO, so please see Annie to check your details.

In the event of any emergency we are advised to stay within our school grounds unless immediate danger is imminent.

When an emergency occurs we will:



- Send a notice to appear on our school facebook page Kaikōura Suburban Family and Whanau, HERO newsfeed and on Skool Loop.
- Send a bulk text message to all parents via HERO text messages.
- Please stay away until you are advised it is safe to come and collect your child/ren. You may only collect your own child/ren unless you have written permission from another parent to collect their child/ren. This is to avoid confusion and ensure the safety of all children during an emergency.
- If there is no internet or mobile phone service, we will be unable to alert parents so parents and whanau are welcome to come to the school, if it is safe to do so.
- If after two hours, no contact has been received from a family and no contact is able to be made, the school staff will keep the remaining children and will follow the directions of the emergency services.
- Please alert your child's class teacher if you are taking your child away from the school grounds. Class teachers of other children you are taking must also be informed.
- Please develop your own family and whānau plans for when there is an emergency during school hours.

Over the holidays there are a few projects going on. We have new carpet tiles going into Toroa, the Whare Ako and Titi classes and some new entry carpet into Piwakawaka. This is being supplied by Ngā iti Kahurangi, a small rural schools programme which improves heat, light and noise in classrooms. We are expecting the painters to complete the exterior painting of our school buildings as part of our building plan.

At the end of this year, we will complete our final year in our strategic plan. This is a simple, clear document that sets out what a school wants to achieve over the next few years and how it plans to get there. It acts like a roadmap for the school.

It includes:

- The school's big goals what the school is aiming to improve or achieve (for example, better student learning, stronger community involvement, or improved wellbeing).
- How it will reach those goals the key steps or actions the school will take.
- How progress will be measured how the school will know if things are working and goals are being met.

The strategic plan helps make sure everyone in the school community – staff, students, whānau, and the board – is heading in the same direction and working together toward shared priorities. It's usually written for a period of 3–4 years, but reviewed and updated regularly to make sure it stays relevant.

To write a new plan, we need to get the input not only from staff and students but from you as parents. In Term 3, there will be a weekly question displayed next to the calendar outside Annie's office, along with a supply of post it notes and pens. Please add your thoughts on a post it and stick it on the question sheet. These question sheets will be transferred to the Whare Ako where they can continue to be accessed for feedback before assemblies and gatherings. We also will be sending out texts to short answer questions via the HERO messaging system. The text will come from a four digit number e.g. 4376 and will have Kaikoura Suburban School in the message. Please take two minutes to respond as your feedback is valued in our direction for the school.

Reports were posted on HERO last week along with updated curriculum goals from the refreshed NZ curriculum. We notice that some reports have not been read so if you are having any problems accessing these, please email Annie and ask for a copy of the HERO help sheet for parents. It's a wordy document but Annie assures me it's got everything you need to know! Teaching staff are happy to help with technical issues, please just ask.

School resumes again on Monday 14th of July. Happy holidays everyone!
