Principal's Message

Kia ora parents and whanau

This term our learning is centred around the Aotearoa New Zealand Histories curriculum and we have had two school outings supporting our learning recently. Two weeks ago we ventured up the Coast with Maurice Manawatu to hear the pūrākau associated with the pou along our coastline, north of Kaikōura. Last week we were lucky to visit Takahanga marae and Matura Maurice shared the pūrākau that tells the story of the panels inside the whare nui. We look forward to continuing our relationship with Ngāti Kuri. As always thank you to all our parents who helped with transport and supervision on both of our trips. I've had some great feedback from parents and whanau and our students were engaged and interested in the learning. Next week is New Zealand Maths Week and our students will be participating in activities that provide lots of mathematical opportunities and discussion and we will be sharing our learning on our usual social media, so stay tuned!

The Board has received notification that the Education Review Office (ERO) will be visiting us on Wednesday the 17th of September as part of their review process. It has been 18 months since our last report and our evaluation partners will be visiting the school to see how we have progressed against the goals set for us from our last report. We are looking forward to having Victoria and Murray seeing our kura in action for the day.

Thank you to those of you who responded to the first of our strategic plan questions surveying our parent community on the direction of the school for the next three years. We have two ways you can provide feedback. There are pens and post it notes with a question outside Kea classroom and you are able to answer the question there. Anonymous responses are collated and added to the display in the Whare Ako. Our students and staff are also providing their voice. FIELD TRIP TO THE MARAE






On Wednesday the 30th, we went to the Takahanga Marae to continue are learning about the Ngāti Kuri culture.


Police Vetting


