Principal's Message

Kia ora parents and whanau

A huge thank you to all our Suburban whanau who helped at the Whale Run two weeks ago. There are so many of you who helped. It would be impossible to name everyone but I am so amazed at how everyone pulled together and made the day a great one. I am grateful to everyone for their support of our fundraiser! While the day's weather didn't quite meet our expectations, our competitors didn't seem to mind so much. We had approximately 420 competitors take part in the three distances and judging from the photos they look quite happy running and walking in the rain.

At our assembly last week, children who had been displaying our fortnightly value of R for Respect had their names entered on a prize wheel. The winner was Ava from Piwakawaka who won the Subway voucher. The vouchers have been kindly sponsored by Vince from Subway and we thank him for helping us to recognise and reward our students who display our FORCE values. It was a great opportunity to showcase what has been happening this year and showing evidence of how we are meeting our annual implementation plan. As soon as we have our written report from ERO, I will share it with you.

Thank you to Toni Batey who came into school for two days last week to teach our students T Ball. She taught throwing, catching, batting and fielding skills which the children really enjoyed. We are so lucky to have Toni in our community.

The netball season has drawn to a close and our FORCE netballers were unlucky not to win their game on Saturday. It was a play off game for 3rd in their grade so they ended up 4th overall. While they were disappointed not to win, they should be very proud of their growth in skills which has been evident throughout the season and making us very proud of them and the way they represented our school. They came armed with solar glasses and telescopes and we were able to have a closer look at the sun. 


