## Principal's Message

Kia ora parents and whanau

We've been enjoying the fine and hot weather and our swimming lessons from Toni Batey over the last two weeks. We have missed a couple of lessons so these will be completed in early December and there are two more lessons scheduled for 2026.

We have been so busy, we are really struggling to find days to fit all our activities in!

In the last fortnight...

Our Year 6 students visited Kaikōura High School for their transition day on Friday 31st of October. They had a fantastic day where they met and reunited with friends and got to know some of the teachers they will have in 2026.



New Zealand Storylines visited the school last Thursday. This is a free programme that allows visiting authors and illustrators to visit schools to talk about their work. Piwakawaka and Titi class had Kate De Goldi visit them and talk about her books which they all really enjoyed. Toroa class had Munro Te Whata visit, an illustrator and animator. He showed us his work and then showed us the technology he uses to complete his illustrations. Lucky Paddy, he became the subject of this cartoon portrait.

We had day visitors who came to see a snapshot of the fun, thank you to you all for coming down to Waipara Adventure Centre and joining us on camp.

I have some reservations about the rigidity of thinking that all children know the same things and learn at the same pace, which is not my experience at all in my 27 years in the classroom. Over the holidays I will be looking at this and how specific topics for each year group can be taught in our multi level classrooms. This is something that has been given little thought to although it affects many schools in New Zealand.

Watch this space! Exciting things are happening, and we'll keep you posted as the building work progresses!

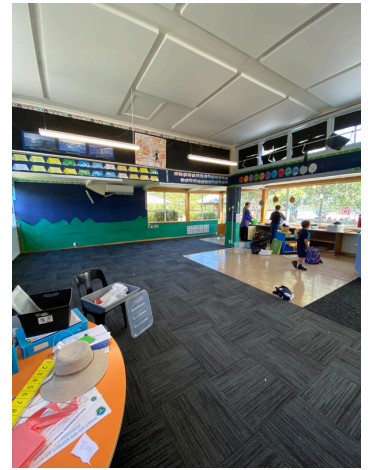
## Enviroschool Update

On the bright side though, Mels from Holland has joined us. He has been teaching us some basic words in Dutch but we need to keep working hard on that.

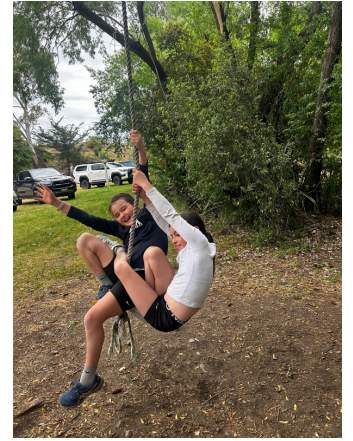

We will need lots of parent helpers.



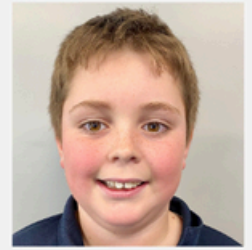
## Toroa Class



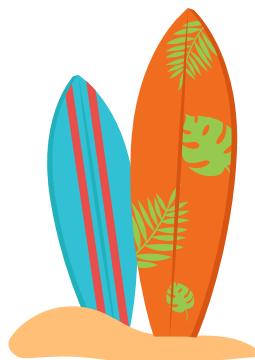

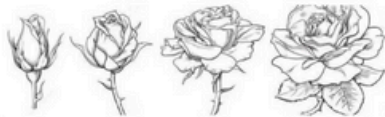
